5-71-209. Harassing communications.

A person commits the offense of harassing communications if, with the purpose to harass, annoy, or alarm another person, the person:

Communicates with a person, anonymously or otherwise, by telephone, telegraph, mail, or any other form of written communication, in a manner likely to harass, annoy, or cause alarm;

Makes a telephone call or causes a telephone to ring repeatedly, with no purpose of legitimate communication, regardless of whether a conversation ensues; or

Knowingly permits any telephone under his or her control to be used for any purpose prohibited by this section.

Harassing communications is a Class A misdemeanor.
